Dear Team,

Good news! Last June, DCPI sent a team of researchers to Kenya to interview church planting leaders who had been previously trained in one or more of our tracks from the years 2003 through 2007.

Our objective was to determine how effectively our trained leaders have been in planting new churches. We also wanted to discover the number of people who became new Christians because of the presence of these church plants.

This was the third research trip for DCPI. Our first research project was conducted in India in July 2007, and the second one was done in Ghana in October 2007.

The results of the Kenya study were very encouraging and helped us discover the impact and fruit of God's work through DCPI. We interviewed 197 (11%) of the 1,800 leaders who have been trained in that country since 2003. We found that for every leader we trained, 2.1 churches have been planted! Even more exciting, for every church that has been planted 78 precious people have converted to Christ!

Then, we averaged the results of all 3 research studies and applied them to the total number of church planters trained by DCPI worldwide from our beginnings in 1995 to 2007. Each country is different and results will vary. But if the average holds true for what God has done worldwide, this means that:

- **DCPI trained leaders have planted 54,000+ churches in 73 countries!**
- There have been an average of 46.7 conversions per church plant!
- **There are now more than 2,500,000 people who have received Jesus as their Lord and Savior in churches planted by DCPI trained leaders!**

Praise God for his work in our world! We are grateful to be serving Him!
